This tree sapling was budgrafted from a Tulip Poplar, the last surviving "Liberty Tree" in Annapolis, MD. "Liberty Trees" were gathering places for "Sons of Liberty" throughout the American colonies to meet and hold discussions while planting the seeds of the American Revolution. The tree has become symbols of freedom, perseverance and unity.


COMING SOON

The Battle Field Cross has no religious connections and was first started during the Civil War as a marker for casualties waiting burial. During each conflict the Battle Field Cross was adapted resulting in the configuration represented at the site. The weapon, bayonet, boots, helmet and dog tags depict the conflict.

The purpose of the Tribute to Veterans Memorial is to honor the veterans of Warren County, MO who gave all in service to their Country!

These 72 veterans from World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Persian Gulf War, War in Iraq, War in Afghanistan will be remembered along with their Gold Star Families. Any future conflict casualties will be added as required.

The Missouri Red Granite wall has 72 names of those who paid the ultimate sacrifice in our Republic's conflicts from World War One to present day. The United States Flag and POW/MIA Flag, six Service Flags pay tribute to all veterans who served in all branches of service. The Statue of the Woman, Child and Battle Field Cross is a tribute to Gold Star Families.



The Tribute to Veterans Memorial flies eight flags:

- The American Flag
- POW/MIA Flag on a 30-foot Pole
- Six 25-foot poles fly the Army Flag
- Marine Corps Flag
- Navy Flag
- Air Force Flag
- · Coast Guard Flag, and the
- Merchant Marines Flag
